CLUB RIDE

If you were unable to join us on our club ride after our February meeting, you missed an eventful day. We received a dusting of snow that morning. It was windy and the temperature didn't reach above zero. The cold temps & wind kept the fresh snow from packing and created snow dust. This made for poor visibility and a very cold ride.

Gary Gevers, club member and DNR Snowmobile Safety Instructor, gave a safety talk before heading out on our ride. He had a route planned out with stops for fuel and rest along the way. Gary was the leader and another member was the sweeper (last person). Both wore high visibility safety vests.

A short time into our ride, Gary's sled wasn't running properly so he decided to turn around and head for home. A new leader took over and our group continued on our way. We stopped for lunch at Ponderosa Pines. While there, we were told that a sled was on fire on a trail in Rome. Soon after we found out it was Gary's sled. Gary was uninjured but his sled was a total loss.

Our group then decided to head to Pop A Top in Almond/Bancroft. When leaving Pop A Top, we decided to take a different route home that we thought would be quicker. We ended up heading in the wrong direction. We turned around and the group got out of order. Shortly after, with poor visibility and a sharp corner, Linda Randall lost control of her sled and ended up in the creek. When the person behind her came around the corner, Linda was below eye level and they did not see her. We continued on with poor visibility from the snow dust and a cold group wanting to get to our next stop. We didn't notice we had lost Linda until we arrived at our next stop. Linda walked 45 minutes in wet gear back to Pop A Top. She was covered in ice from head to toe by the time she arrived. The nice people at the bar helped Linda by giving her dry clothes and then pulled her sled out of the creek.

We had the perfect storm of weather and mechanical issues that contributed to these events. We are very fortunate that no one was hurt. We learned that no matter how prepared you are things can still happen. If you have never taken a snowmobile safety class, you should consider it. Our club assists with DNR safety classes and we hold an informal adult safety class each year.

Safety Tips: Never ride alone. Tell someone where you will be going and when you will return. Carry your cellphone on you and do not store it in your sled. When riding in a group, always keep an eye on the person behind you. Stop and wait or turn around if you lose sight of them. Always stay in the same order. Buddy up with another rider. Always carry proper survival gear. Link for what to carry: <u>https://www.romesnobandits.com/Safety-Tips.php</u>. Stop at all stops sign. You are responsible for only yourself when crossing roads. Do not wave anyone across the road. Everyone must come to a complete stop. The fine is over \$200.00 if you get caught not complying. Always put your least experienced riders toward the front of the group. The lead and tail person should periodically take a count of people in the group to make sure no one is missing.


