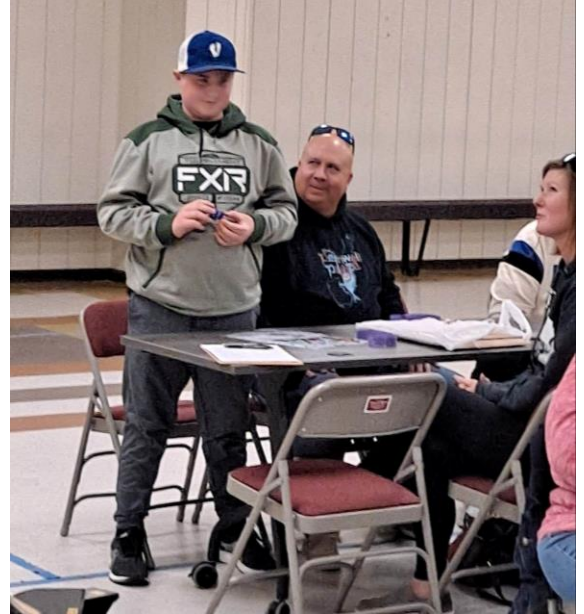

Youth Member Fletcher Daun



The Rome Sno-Bandits sponsored Fletcher Daun the past two years, supporting him, and assisting him with his expenses for snowmobile racing. Fletcher raced with the Wisconsin Kids Snowmobile Racing Association (WKSRA) based out of northern Wisconsin. Fletcher's Papa, Reg Videgar, was his crew chief for both seasons and put in a ton of time on his sleds to do what he could to make sure they were in proper working order for our favorite racer - #999. Fletcher attended eight races, racing in 120 Improved and 206 Semi-Pro.

When Fletcher began the 2023 season, he was nervous and scared after running his 206 on hot laps and didn't want to race the sled. Through encouragement and support, Fletcher improved each race. By the sixth race, he was seen passing kids and no longer coming in dead last. At the very last race in Minocqua, WI, upon a sea of spectators, Fletcher showed confidence and determination, and made it to the finals placing sixth! It was an incredible "win" for Fletcher, something he worked extremely hard for. For the 120 improved class, overall, Fletcher placed fifth for the season.

Also at the Minocqua race, Fletcher was given the chance to race a teammate's Champ sled. The Champ is a modified sled, sits very low to the ground, and can go 30+ miles per hour. While this scared his mama, Fletcher was ready and excited to give it a try. Despite a couple spills, he did amazing for his first attempt and was thrilled to have been given that incredible opportunity.

Fletcher will be turning 12 in January 2024 and ready to ride the trails. Thus, we made the decision to retire him from racing. Fletcher learned what true sportsmanship is like, gained confidence, and life-long friends through the WKSRA. Any child, ages 4-14 can race in this circuit. The racing families are extremely welcoming, helpful, and want to see everyone succeed. If you or anyone you know has any interest, please reach out to me. We will miss our racing family greatly, but plan to support them by watching them from the sidelines.

We greatly appreciate the Sno-Bandits support of Fletcher and his racing the last two seasons. This isn't the end of us – we look forward to many more continued opportunities to have fun with and support our fellow Sno-Bandits.

Secretary's Report

Adams County Snowmobile Association Report

CDAC Meeting regarding the holiday hunt will be held April 24th at the Adams County Community Center. Steve MacIntosh is the new president of the association. All other positions remained the same. Adams County Chamber of Commerce has 4 pages on snowmobiling in the new magazine.

AWSC Report

The spring convention was held in Green Bay on March 24th – 26th.

Elections: President- Lori Heidemen, Vice President- Greg Roscizewski, Secretary- Sue Smedegard
Treasurer- Lauren Levey, Executive Director- Mike Holden

Safety Report- 18 Deaths in Wisconsin. All but 2 were over the age of 40. 11 were over the age of 50. Faster machines and less agile riders. Speed and alcohol were factors. Longer season this year in many areas. Many icy conditions this year.

Safety and Trespassing – More Law Enforcement needed on the trails. Rec Council is working on getting more money to local Law Enforcement budget. Trying to increase the amount from \$396,000 to \$800,000. The Legislative Committee is also trying to keep the \$1.2 million from tribal gaming in the budget for DNR law enforcement. Everyone needs to talk to their legislators about this.

Legislation- There are two bills in Madison.

SB105 and AB98 - Signs on Public land and State-owned property. To keep informational signs leading to businesses on state trails.

SB136 and AB130 - Is to raise the cap on Supplemental grooming from \$900-\$1500. Many clubs are grooming past their funding. The money is there, we just need to get it into their hands.

Get to know your legislators!!!! Call or email them and let them know that these things are needed for our sport to continue.

Governors Snowmobile Council- They approved 73 projects for a total of \$5.9 million. Approximately \$900,000 in grants were also approved for storm damage.

Snowmobile Friendly- The application process helps the clubs create a greater bond between your club, Police, Fire and Rescue and your community. It is a process to help create better and safer trails.

Scholarships – There were 44 applications for scholarships. There were 13 awarded for a total of \$10,000 to 13 students in 11 different counties.

The AWSC ran out of non-resident trail passes – 25,000 sold this season. 10,000 students graduated from safety classes – 234 “in person” classes held. 26,000 hours of snowmobile enforcement in 2022 between the DNR and 40 sheriff’s departments. 1,175 snowmobilers were “contacted” in 1 weekend.

There are over 600 clubs with 41,000 members and 25,000 miles of trails in Wisconsin

There were 10 million page views of Travel Wisconsin this season.

1.6 million page views of the snow report. 1.4 million page views of the snowmobile page.

This was a 28% increase over last year. There were 338,000 unique users between November and March
