#### Zero alcohol keeps you safe on the trail

Drinking alcohol before snowmobiling or during your ride slows your reactions, impairs your judgment, and is a leading contributor to snowmobiling deaths. Last winter, alcohol was involved in 70 percent of the 23 snowmobiling fatalities.

Join DNR in the international zero alcohol campaign that urges every snowmobiler to take personal responsibility for reducing alcohol-related crashes. Wisconsin conservation wardens will be handing out zero alcohol stickers to snowmobilers and asking you to display it. See why zero alcohol is the answer

Here's what you can do to help:

Display the sticker on your helmet, snowmobile, trailer, or vehicle. Choose to be 100 percent alcohol-free until after your ride is over and you're safely home. Commit to riding only with other snowmobilers who are alcohol-free.


#### Slow down

Speed is a contributing factor in nearly all fatal snowmobiling accidents. Drivers should proceed at a pace that will allow ample reaction time for any situation. Drive at moderate speeds, and drive defensively, especially after sunset.

## Minutes from the Rome Sno-Bandits Meeting December 14th, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 9:07 am with the president in the chair and seven officers present. There were 39 members in attendance. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

#### Secretary's Report

There were no changes to the Secretary's report. A motion was made by Gary Gevers to accept the report as it was presented in the newsletter. Kathy Halverson seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Cathy Steinke reported on the checking & savings account balances. Bob Sweet made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Jerry Wiessinger seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

#### **Social Committee Report**

No cards were sent out this month. After donuts were purchased, there is a balance of \$123.60 in the kitty.

We had four new members in attendance. The club welcomed Joe Bellocchio, Al Kraft, Tim Kane and Chris Johnson.

President Jim Fisher thanked everyone that helped run Christmas in Rome. Marci & Jerry Wiessinger did a great job organizing the chili challenge and Melissa Rhodes and Suzanne Krostreva helped run it. Jerry Wiessinger, Gary Gevers, & Larry Halverson ran the sleigh rides. Santa and his Elf, Kathy Halverson entertained the children. We had over 130 kids in attendance. This was one of our biggest turnouts. Visit Rome helped with advertising our event.

#### **Trail Boss Report**

The fall was tough as far as extra work. High winds raised havoc in some areas. Signs were twisted or blown over and the wet ground didn't help. Hopefully we have most of that taken care of. If you see a problem with signs or trees down, let us know and we will get it taken care of. Jim Fisher and Scott Fitzgerald took care of a tree on Archer that was down. John Steinke, Gary Gevers & Larry Halverson took care of two trees that were down over the trail on Archer and 16<sup>th</sup> area.

There are still water problems in a lot of areas. We are not in real bad shape except for the one on Beaver were we always have problems. Some clubs to our south probably will not be able to open this year. Be aware of that as you are out riding.

Monday, December 16<sup>th</sup> is the date we can officially open the trails but unless something drastic changes, it doesn't look like that will happen. Check the website for trail reports. Adams County Parks & Recreation is the official phone number and website for opening and closing reports. We share their information on our website and Facebook page. Adams County updates their information when the trails open and close and try to update conditions on Wednesdays. Feel free to call Larry if you have any questions. There is a new procedure for opening and closing trails. Club representatives report the Adams County Alliance President to give trail conditions.

On Monday, Jim Fisher, Tom Gabriel, Gary Gevers, Tedd Sorenson, John Steinke, Jerry Wiessinger, and Larry Halverson meet at the groomer shed. They serviced the John Deer and went over the drag. 800 lbs. of new weights were added to the front of the tractor and new chains were put on the front of the tractor. GPS unit was installed. This will make it much easier on the groomer operators. No paper work is need. There was a problem with the alternator. It cost just over \$200.00 to get it fixed. Tractor should be in good condition and ready to go for the season. All we need now is that white stuff.

## **Activities Report**

Melissa reported that the club trip will be February  $20^{th} - 23^{rd}$  at the Rustic Manor Motor Lodge in St. Germain. We 20 rooms booked by club members at this time. We are no longer holding rooms but if you are interested in going, contact the lodge to see if they have rooms available. Contact Melissa if you have any questions.

### **Adams County Report**

Larry Halverson, Gary Gevers, and Melissa Rhodes attended the Adams County meeting along with Lori Heideman, AWSC Vice President.

All trails need to be marked and signed. All our maintenance hours need to be turned in before the end of the year.

Adams County Snowmobile Alliance is teaming up with Grand Marsh Pathfinders. On February 1<sup>st</sup> the Pathfinders are holding an antique snowmobile show at the Cedar Shack south of Adams on Highway 13. The Adams County Snowmobile Alliance is going to have meat raffles, basket raffles, and gun raffles at this event. All clubs are asked to donate baskets for this event. Our club will donate one or two baskets.

The first half of the Snowmobile Safety Class was held on Tuesday December 10<sup>th</sup> at the Grand Marsh groomer shed. Jim Fisher helped Gary Gevers teach the class. There were 11 kids that showed up. The second half of the class is Saturday December 21<sup>st</sup>.

Lori Heideman, AWCS Vice President, spoke about the number one complaint being trespassing. Warn people if you see them trespassing that it can be a costly fine and could mean a trail closure. Trails have been closed when people have gone off trails or been on them when they are not supposed to be. She also spoke on the E10 and E15 gas issue. Gas companies are trying to pass a bill so all gas would run through one nozzle. The problem being, you might get a gallon or two of the wrong gas before you get what you want. AWSC is not backing this bill, just making you aware of it.

#### **New Business**

Tom Koren of The Lure Bar & Grill approached Jim Fisher about the possibility of having a radar run at their location in January or February. Insurance costs were discussed. It is also hard to get help for these events. Larry is going to talk with Kellner Knights to see what they pay for insurance for their radar run. This would have to be a 2021 event if we do anything. More information is needed and this will be discussed in the future.

Larry Halverson made a motion to buy a \$25.00 gift card from Pritzl's for Fran, the Town of Rome custodian. She cleans up after us and arranges everything. She always goes out of her way to help us out. It was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Gary Gevers. All in favor. Motion passed.

Kathy Halverson and Melissa Rhodes are working on the Snowmobile Friendly Community application. Kathy has meet with the police department to discuss safety and is going to meet with the Town of Rome to get copies of our ordinances. Kathy will submit the application within the next couple weeks. There is a lot of work involved in the application. If our club is awarded, we will have this for four years. We will be given signage to place in our town. Lori Heideman, Vice President of the AWSC, has been very helpful with this process.

Melissa has made a brochure about our club to be submitted with our application and it will also be distributed by Visit Rome and at locations throughout our community.

The Town of Rome has a tourism division called Visit Rome. They have been very helpful in promoting our club. They have a section for our club on their Visit Rome website. They also have a Facebook page.

A motion to adjourn at 9:45 am was made by Wayne Mikrut and seconded by Ted Sorenson. All were in favor. Motion carried. Meeting Adjourned.
