Message From Trail Boss, Jerry Wiessinger

Well, we asked Larry for snow and he came through with a lot of heavy wet snow which froze to everything, especially the trees. The heavy wet snow caused extensive tree damage which made the trails impassable. Thanks to fifteen members and volunteers to the Trail Committee that came out to work in terrible cold conditions with chainsaws and pole-saws to clear fallen trees from the trails. They spent over 150 manhours in three days to get the corridor and trails to our sponsors open. The Country Sports trail remained blocked until this week when Scott and friends got it cleared. We are still waiting for Adams County's insurance carrier to work out the land use agreement language with Wisconsin Power & Light for the Country Sports trail through the solar project land. All the trails other than County Sports were rolled, then after more snow and high winds, were groomed. The trails were in very good early season condition with a good base, then the warm weather arrived, and the trails had to be closed after only being open for two days. We are hoping that everyone stays off the trails so when the cooler weather returns, we can open the trails again.

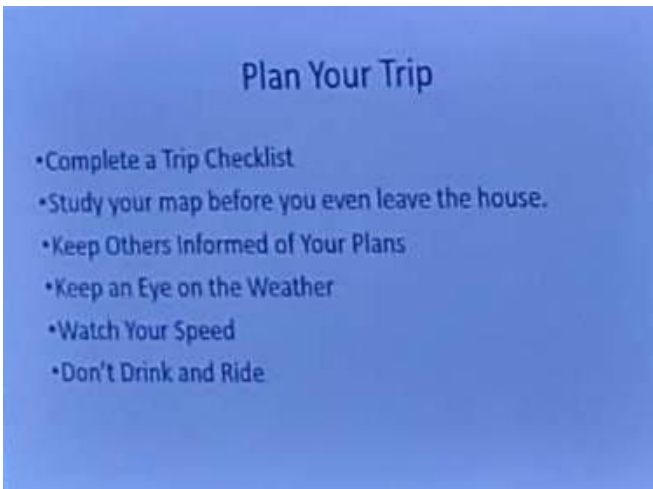

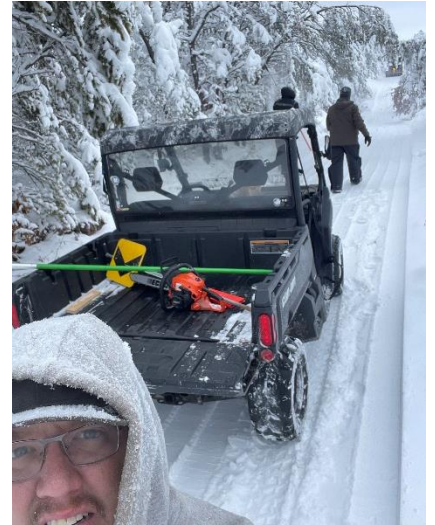
2022 Informal Safety Class

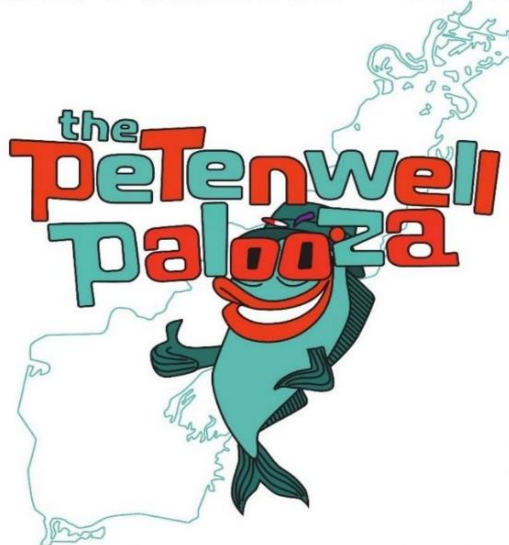

DNR Safety Tips



ZERO ALCOHOL KEEPS YOU SAFE ON THE TRAIL

Drinking alcohol before snowmobiling or during your ride slows your reactions, impairs your judgment, and is a leading contributor to snowmobiling deaths. Last winter, alcohol was involved in 70 percent of the 23 snowmobiling fatalities.

Join DNR in the international zero alcohol campaign that urges every snowmobiler to take personal responsibility for reducing alcohol-related crashes. Wisconsin conservation wardens will be handing out zero alcohol stickers to snowmobilers and asking you to display it.

Here's what you can do to help:

- Display the sticker on your helmet, snowmobile, trailer, or vehicle.
- Choose to be 100 percent alcohol-free until after your ride is over and you're safely home.
- Commit to riding only with other snowmobilers who are alcohol-free.

Wisconsin's recreation safety specialists recommend you take these other precautions to stay safe on the trails this winter:

Slow down. Speed is a contributing factor in nearly all fatal snowmobiling accidents. Drivers should proceed at a pace that will allow ample reaction time for any situation. Drive at moderate speeds, and drive defensively, especially after sunset.

Carry a first-aid kit and dress appropriately. Your first-aid kit should include a flashlight, knife, compass, map, and waterproof matches. Always wear a helmet with goggles or a face shield to prevent injuries from twigs and flying debris. Wear layers of water-repellent clothing and make sure you have no loose ends that might catch in the machine or tangle in equipment.

Avoid traveling across bodies of water when uncertain of ice thickness or water currents. Rapidly changing weather and moving water in streams and lake inlets also affect the thickness and strength of ice on lakes and ponds. Snow cover can act as a blanket and prevents thick strong ice from forming.

Stay on marked trails or, where allowed, on the right shoulder of the road. Be alert for fences, tree stumps and stretched wire that may be concealed by snow.

Never travel alone. Most snowmobile accidents result in personal injury. The most dangerous situations occur when a person is injured and alone. If you must travel alone, tell someone your destination, planned route, and when you will return.

The balance in the fund is \$132.74.

Activities Report

The CMN Radiothon was a lot of fun. Thank you to all 8 club members that participated. The goal of the event was to raise \$200,000 and \$235,374.37 was raised. The Rome SnoBandits \$1,000 match was exceeded by \$1,230.00. Our power hour match total was \$2,240 and our three-hour total was over \$7,000.

The Romemakers sent us a certificate of appreciation for helping with the Halloween party.

We have 7 new members and 126 memberships to date.

The Angel Tree program sent a thank you card for our \$100 donation.

The Creepers Car Club and Rome Dog Park would like to purchase a bench in memory of Larry Halverson. They would like us to go in on the bench with them. The total cost of the bench is \$1,920.47 and would be split three ways at \$640.15 each. The Town of Rome Parks & Recreation Committee approved the bench. Suzanne Kostreva made a motion to spend up to \$650.00 on a Memorial Bench for Larry Halverson. Mark Lubecke seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The Capital Gains Committee was formed a while back. President, Tom Warner has asked Bryan Meyer to lead this committee. John Steinke will stay on the committee and Warren Starner and Lori Heideman will join the committee.

New Business

We have two old heavy tables in the groomer shed that we no longer use. If anyone would like the tables, please let us know.

The Adams County Pink Ribbon Ride will be held on the same day as our fisheriee due to there being no other dates available for our fisheriee. Melissa Rhodes made a motion to donate \$200 to the Pink Ribbon Ride. John Steinke seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The CMN Polar Plunge will be held at the Lure on January 1st at 1:00 pm. Club members, Jenny Daun, Gunnar Anderson and Fletcher Daun will be jumping as Team Rome SnoBandits. Lori Heideman made a motion for our club to donate up to \$500 in matching donations. Scott Murphy seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion passed. Donations can be given to Cathy Steinke or dropped off by Melissa at Hoffman Trucking & Excavating.

A motion to adjourn at 10:07 am was made by Melissa Rhodes and seconded by Warren Starner. All were in favor. Motion carried. Meeting Adjourned.

Adams County Snowmobile Association Minutes December 1st, 2022 - Cedar Shack

The December 1, 2022 meeting was called to order at 7:01pm by President Gordy Carlson. There were 24 members present. All clubs were represented except New Haven.

The Secretary read the minutes from the November 2nd meeting. There was one correction. Dennis Kulwicki was not the one talking about the logo, it was Bob Schmidt. A motion to accept, with the correction was made by Nancy Carlson, seconded by Melissa Rhodes. All in favor, motion carries.

The Treasurer reported on 3 checks written... reimburse Gary Gevers for the fall workshop, buy ink for the printer and association paid for half the cost of the Larry Halverson memorial trail sign and deposits for map money and membership dues made for a balance of \$16,864.58, a motion to accept was made by Gary Gevers seconded by Ed Stevens.

Darren reminded all to keep track of hours worked. If you are paying someone to do trail work get a receipt, let him know. Get your trail work hours into him by the end of the year.

Gary talked about ISHOF needing donations from both clubs and associations to keep going. A suggestion of \$50 for clubs and \$100 for associations. A motion to donate \$100 was made by Gary Gevers, seconded by Jim Smith. All in favor, motion carries.

Brent York introduced Graham McFarland as our new Recreation Deputy officer. He has been with the Sheriff's department for almost 5 years. He told those present that he and Graham were attending the Rome Sno-Bandits meeting on December 10th to do an adult safety class. Anyone is invited to join them at the meeting at the Rome Town Hall. Their meeting starts at 9am followed by the safety class. They would like to do this at all club meetings if you are interested.

Steve reported that the maps were not ready yet. They are being printed next week and ready for all to get next week. A time will be set up to meet at Cedar Shack to get them. Take only what you need right now so there will be more available later. Watch your emails. The total cost for 8,000 maps and 60 laminated maps is \$3966.00. That is only \$200 more than the old maps on the poorer paper we had last time.

Gordy said that the opening of trails will be December 15th if there are groomed trails. Do your snow dance!!

Old Business: Melissa has the prices for the ACSA decals. The person she contacted quoted her \$4-5 for a 4-inch circle. Long sleeve t-shirts are \$18, hooded sweatshirts are \$30, crew neck sweatshirts are \$25, \$3 extra for 2x and up.

New Business: Kurt talked about the MS ride on January 21st in Lac Du Flambeau. It is the 40th year of this ride. He asked clubs to donate to this event. Gordy made a motion to donate \$250 towards this, Kurt seconded it. All in favor, motion carries.

Melissa told of the Marshfield Hospital's Children's Miracle Network telethon on Dec 2nd. Sno-Bandits are manning the phones in the afternoon and will match the first \$1000 they raise. A motion by Nancy Carlson was made to donate \$100, seconded by Gary Gevers. All in favor, motion carries. Gary said to look at the AWSC website to see all kinds of things about the fall convention and workshops. Great info!!

A large discussion about the grooming of trails and then the opening of these trails. Greg Huber felt that the trails should open as soon as 24 hours after the measurable snowfall. Clubs need to talk to their Zone coordinator as soon as they are done grooming. Todd Stammen talked about club insurance and deductible costs. It would help if you had anti-theft device on your club machines. This will be discussed at our next meeting.

A motion to adjourn at 7:41pm was made by Nancy Carlson, seconded by Greg Huber. All in favor.
