# Message From Trail Boss, Jerry Wiessinger

While there is not much work to be done on the trails this time of the year, there is always work behind the scenes to be done before next season. We have a bunch of old trail signs that need repair or recycling if someone is looking for a rainy-day project. We are working on a new way finding signs for all the intersections.

Gary recovered a bunch of the old, old trails signs that were stored by Hoffman's barn. These are 30 plus years old. These were built out of steel all welded together. They are in very good condition for their age and are on display in the Groomer Shed. We are looking to display some on the trails. See photos below.

The Trail Committee has put together a plan to complete the Groomer Shed building project that was started in 2015 when we built the building. We would like to finish the project with a concrete floor, insulated ceiling, insulated paneled walls, additional lighting, and a heating unit. The plan with estimated costs of \$58,000 was presented at the May meeting to be considered as a 2024 capital investment. We have funds available to cover the cost without financing. This may be voted on at the June meeting. Copies of the detailed estimates were handed out for members to review. They are also in the minutes. If you would like a copy, please contact me.

With the Car Show coming up fast on June 17<sup>th</sup>, all efforts are now on the Car Show.

Jerry has been in contact with the owner of the second solar plant. Routes are being discussed. We can run on easements if we stay away from towers.

Gary picked up old steel trail signs from Hoffman Trucking that were in storage in their old barn. Gary had them on display for everyone to see at the meeting.

Trail signs need work. Jerry will set up a work date for this project.

### **Old Business**

Snowmobile Friendly Community application will need to be worked on after the car show. We will be looking for people to be on the committee.

Warren Starner will pick up 4 outlet adapters for the car show.

#### **New Business**

Cyndee Lewis brought two t-shirt designs for the car show to be voted on. Melissa Rhodes made a motion to order the minimum of 36 decals of each design. Gary Gevers seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

Jeff Parmeter brought a sample of thermal cups designed by Awards N More. Allison Young made a motion to order 50 of the cups at a cost of \$12 each. Warren Starner seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried.

The board had a zoom meeting on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. We discussed having a reserve fund to cover 2 years of operating expenses. Cathy Steinke will look into interest bearing options and we will set aside \$20,000 in this fund.

Melissa Rhodes, Bryan Meyer, Linda Randall and Sue Krueger will work on the donation committee. They will review how much money the club has to donate and where these funds would best be donated.

An audit needs to be done. The directors will do this audit. John Steinke will not be involved in the audit since he is married to our treasurer. Jerry Wiessinger will take his place for the audit.

An AWSC Convention & Workshop attendance policy has been set up so we have guidelines and structure to follow. This will also save the club money.

#### POLICY:

- 1. The club will pay for 4 rooms for 2 nights, convention and banquet tickets for those attendees (up to 8 people) who are staying in the Sno Bandit rooms. No per diem. Attendees must be members of the Rome Sno bandits in good standing.
- 2. The board (President, VP, Secretary, Treasurer, Directors) get first choice at attendance in the order listed from our bylaws (above). The directors will get a choice based on seniority as a director.
- 3. The next opportunity goes to the Trail Boss, then the Membership Chair.
- 4. If there is still an open room, we would then open it up to primary membership to attend. If we have more that would like to attend, then we will draw from the names of those interested. If we still cannot find members to go, we will offer it to secondary members.
- 5. If the board chooses, we could add an additional 2 workshop/conference and banquet tickets to be given out in the same order as proposed above for local AWSC events. (Optional)

With this set of guidelines, I would also like to ask any person holding a board position in another snowmobile club or a county snowmobile association to consider exploring having that entity sponsor your AWSC attendance if possible. This would afford Sno- Bandits wishing to attend an event that opportunity.

These guidelines serve as a fair and equitable way for Members of the Rome Sno bandits to be able to attend AWSC Spring and Fall conventions\workshops.

The groomer shed project started in 2015. Club equipment and belongings were stored all over the place. The goal was to get everything under one roof with the funds we had available at the time. The property was purchased from the Town of Rome at a low cost.

The trails committee submitted a request to the Capital Gains/Planning Committee to update the groomer shed. The planning committee reviewed our clubs' future needs and recommends the trails committee idea. A vote will be taken at the next meeting to decide if we should proceed with the updates with or without a grant.
