

Minutes from the Rome Sno-Bandits Meeting October 14th, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am with President, Tom Warner, as the chair and 7 officers present. There were 39 members in attendance. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Welcome new member, Jeff Grimm. Thank you to Steve Ottowitz and John O'Keefe for volunteering to be groomer operators.

Secretary's Report

There were no changes to the Secretary's report. A motion was made by Warren Starner to accept the report as it was presented in the newsletter. Linda Randall seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Cathy Steinke reported on the checking & savings account balances. Bob Sweet made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Ray Glenn seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Linda Randall made a motion to invest \$20,000 in a 12-month CD and to have Treasurer, Cathy Steinke, look into moving the club savings account into a higher earning account. Motion seconded by Jerry Wiessinger. All in favor. Motion carried.

Trails Boss Report

The Trails Committee met and got the equipment ready for the upcoming season. The windows on the tractor were professionally cleaned to remove the haze. The trails will be looked at and a list will be made of what work needs to be done. Brushing and mowing of the trails will be done at the end of the month.

Trail brushing will take place on November 11th at 8:00 a.m. Please make sure to fill out a trail maintenance form so we are reimbursed for your time.

Jerry worked with the DNR to track down who was tearing down a gate on the Country Sports trail. The DNR was able to follow tracks to home and will deal with the violators.

Next year, Wayne Mikrut will need someone to take over Section 5. Please let Jerry or Wayne know if you are interested in doing this.

On the last weekend in April 2024, we will need volunteers to help clean out the groomer shed and move items into storage boxes. Concreate is scheduled to be installed. Hopefully everything will be done by the end of June. We energies will install gas to the groomer shed this fall or spring.

Gary is training John O'Keefe, Steve Ottowitz, and Tom Grabriel for grooming.

Adams County Snowmobile Association October 5, 2023, at Cedar Shack

The October 5th meeting was called to order around 7pm by President Steve McIntosh. There were 36 plus people present. Many Grand Marsh members were in attendance to honor their Trail Boss Dave Ferge who was awarded AWSC Groomer of the Year. We celebrated with pizza for all in attendance. AWSC President Lori Heideman and Miss Snowflake Rachel Burzinski honored Dave and awarded him a plaque. The Grand Marsh club is celebrating their 50th year and Dave has been their groomer for all of those 50 years!! Lori talked about the history of the club and all of their yearly events.

Also in attendance was Deputy Sheriff Craig Orlowski and his K9 Tekla who is 4 years old, to tell of the ATV/UTV fundraiser on October 14th.

The **Secretary** read the minutes from the September meeting. There were no changes. A motion to accept was made by Kathy Halverson and seconded by Gary Gevers. All in favor, motion carries.

The Treasurer was not in attendance. No checks were written so the balance is the same as last month.

Darren congratulated Dave on his award. He asked clubs to have their fall bills to him by January 1st. He has attended a county coordinator meeting today. There will be an online SNARS meeting on Oct 23rd. It will be on the AWSC website and available to watch at a later date.

Gary reminded everyone of the AWSC fall workshop to be held in La Crosse. Classes will be on trailside first aid, SNARS training, DNR safety instructor recertification class, county director responsibilities and a snowmobile friendly class. He reminded the clubs of the availability for scholarships for kids in your club or your relatives to apply for. There is about \$15,000 this year.

Recreation Deputy Graham McFarland is gearing up for the snowmobile season. If you see anything going on that shouldn't be, please notify the sheriff's department. Lori reported that the budget for wardens has almost doubled this year. He is available for snowmobile safety classes. There will be one in Adams at the community center this year, date to be sometime in early December.

Bryan introduced Megan Steckelberg the Adams Chamber executive director. She talked about all of the things that the Chamber can do.

Old Business: Steve talked about the 2024 Power Sport Show at the fairgrounds on October 5th or 6th. All businesses could be there. Clubs who have people to work at the event will receive a share of the proceeds. Talk to your club about your interest in this event. He reminded clubs to get your info sign verbiage and old signs submitted to Steve. If any clubs need more maps, they will be available at the November meeting. Trail changes will not be included until next year. Put up your own signs for these changes this year.

Club dues need to be paid now. It is \$1 per member. See Melissa or Kathy to find out what you owe. We are looking for someone to either take over or help out with the treasurer position to report financials.

New Business: Club events coming up: Oct 14th sheriffs ride, Oct 21st Grand Marsh 50th party, band 7-11 free to the public, Nov 4th Jack Pine gun raffle. Darren reminded clubs to let their landowners know when you will be out on the trails.
